## United States v. Ghailani: Jury Questionnaire

Kaplan to facilitate jury selection in a prosecution for participation in the 1998 bombings of the American embassy in Dar es Salaam, Tanzania, *United States v. Ghailani*, No. 1:98-cr-1023-9 (S.D.N.Y. Sept. 21, 1998). The defendant was a fugitive until 2004, when he was captured and held by the CIA. He was transferred to Guantánamo Bay in 2006 and to the Southern District of New York for prosecution in 2009.

## **Background Information**
