

## Visiting Fellows Program

The Federal Judicial Center established the Visiting Fellows Program in 1992. It provides an opportunity for judges and legal professionals to be “scholars in residence” at the Center. Fellows conduct research in a field related to judicial administration or legal/judicial reforms in their home country. The program also affords participants the opportunity to acquire a deeper understanding of the United States judiciary.

The Center provides fellows with an office and research assistance. It also facilitates meetings with judges, Center staff, and others in the D.C. area with relevant expertise.

The 2024 Fellowship is for a two-week period: September 16 – September 27.

Two fellows will be accepted for this two-week period.

Candidates must have strong English language skills and secure independent funding for their travel, lodging, and related expenses. Fellows must make their own logistical arrangements, including securing a visa, if needed. The Center will consider applicants from any country with which the United States maintains diplomatic relations.

- Research proposal (to include: summary of research focus and experts of interest)
- Resume/CV
- Attestation confirming English language fluency and independent funding

Applications must be received by June 1, 2024. Interviews will be scheduled on a rolling basis, and decisions will be rendered by July 1.
