## **Program Description**

Host Brenda Baldwin-White, Senior Judicial Education Attorney, talks with Dean L. Song Richardson, Dean of the University of California Irvine, School of Law, about promoting equity in the courtroom. While many individuals believe in racial and gender equality and reject discrimination in any form, unconscious mental processes which are shaped over time by history and culture can lead us to view the world through a biased lens and to behave contrary to our deeply held egalitarian values. They will discuss how unconscious biases can influence decision making and judgments in ways that are consequential to courtroom outcomes. They will then offer recommendations for safeguarding against the influence of these unconscious biases.
