## Court Web: Compassionate Release Motions: Through the COVID-19 Pandemic and Beyond

#### **Program Description**

#### Court Web: Compassionate Release Motions: Through the COVID-19 Pandemic and Beyond June 30, 2021 – 1:00 p.m.– 2:00 p.m. ET

Host Brenda Baldwin-White, Senior Judicial Education Attorney, talks with Judges Raymond Jackson and Carol Bagley Amon about the law, practice, and procedure related to the compassionate release statute, 18 U.S.C. § 3582(c)(1)(A). The discussion will trace the development of this statute from its amendment by the First Step Act of 2018, through the tidal wave of pandemic-related motions that shaped the body of case law applying the statute, to its developing application in non-pandemic-related cases. The discussion will also touch upon questions to ask and considerations to keep in mind when presented with a motion for compassionate release, including exhaustion of administrative remedies, appointment of counsel, evidentiary issues, and more.
